Bone and joint health: Discover how resistance training can help

Anne Svetik-Jones will discuss the differences between Osteoarthrosis and Osteoporosis, how resistance training can help to improve bone and joint health, and how exercise can be used as medicine to self-manage many different chronic conditions, including Osteoarthritis and Osteoporosis.
