Cleaners are required to maintain the cleanliness of the facility in all aspects to ensure that YMCA meets and exceeds the expectations of participants, volunteers, staff and visitors.

What You'll Do:

- Perform routine cleaning tasks in both indoor and outdoor non-program areas, including washrooms and showers.
- Carry out all cleaning tasks as assigned including back-of-house spaces and exterior spaces.
- Use efficient methods and appropriate products for cleaning tasks
- Lift up to 25 pounds occasionally (e.g., garbage, furniture, equipment)
- Occasionally work from a 6-foot step ladder
- Maintain high standards aligned with YMCA's recommended practices
- Assist with grounds maintenance, including grass cutting using riding or push mowers
- Support garbage removal and other maintenance duties beyond regular cleaning
- Work outdoors for extended periods, with exposure to various weather conditions on a 1,000-acre site
- Must be able to work a flexible schedule, including early mornings, evenings, weekends and holidays
- Ability to work independently with minimum supervision as well as part of a staff team

- Minimum Grade 11 of School education or equivalent.
- Two (2) years cleaning experience in a recreational service facility is preferred.
- Able to read and follow written cleaning and safety standards to complete assigned duties to the quality level established.
